Healthy Blue Member Updates

- Healthy Blue is continuing to grow through expansion 408,000 individuals have been enrolled in the state's Medicaid program, Healthy Louisiana, since July 2016 and steadily increasing.
- A lot of increase in claims
- Just added a justice involved population program for individuals recently released from incarceration; it's Case Management program went into effect February 1st, 2017.
- State will go to a rebate on our current contract, which is a three year contract. The contract will come up on February 1st, 2018. The state will more than likely ask for two one-year extensions until 2020 rebid.
- There's a thought that there may be a change from 5 Medicaid plans to 3 or 4 plans
- Peter Lambousy, Director of Marketing, encouraged every to see their Primary Care Providers (PCP).
- Peter also encouraged educating kids on healthy eating and health issues.

VABS — Value-added Benefits

- Core services are mandated by the State for all plans
- There is no costs to the member be we are not compensated by the State
- Healthy Blue profits cover the charges
- Adult preventive dental care
 - Oral exam every six months
 - X-rays once a year
 - Teeth cleaning every six months
 - Tooth extraction and fillings
 - Benefit value of \$500.00
 - The \$500.00 cannot be used for one service
 - A manage care of North America for kids dental coverage

• Adult vision care

- Eye exam once a year
- Glasses (frames and lenses) once a year

 Healthy Rewards, an incentive program for when you go to your doctor visits and checkups. After you enroll in Healthy Rewards, you'll get a Healthy Rewards debit card. Money you earn will be loaded onto the card.

• Programs and incentives for pregnant women and new moms

- Up to \$75 in gift cards for pregnant members and new moms with our New Baby, New LifeSM program
- Free portable crib or infant car seat for going to required doctor visits
- Warm Health, a program for eligible pregnant members to get tips on how to have a healthy pregnancy. Eligible new moms will also get tips on caring for her new baby.
- o In-home postpartum visits for new moms unable to get to the doctor office
- Circumcisions for newborn boys

Healthy lifestyle and weight management programs

- o Booster seat after completing required well-child visits for children age 6
- Free Boys & Girls Club membership for eligible members ages 6-18
- Free Weight Watchers® meeting vouchers for eligible members age 18 and older
- Healthy Families nutrition and fitness program for qualified families
- Low co-pays for over-the-counter medicines with a prescription from a doctor
- Up to 350 additional minutes and unlimited texts every month for your phone for eligible members
- Up to eight hours of respite services each month for caregivers
- o Community outreach and support: helping you access the services you need
- Community back-to-school supplies drives
- o Community baby showers
- Community health educators
- Community diaper drives

- There's a high needs list of inmates and there's a mandate to reach out to everyone on the list
